## KS1 Ages 5-7

### English 1 a Week Challenge

Children will enjoy a weekly story and take part in a fun activity. We will explore favourite books such as **Handa's Surprise, The Tiger Who Came to Tea, Dogger, The Day the Crayons Quit, Not Now, Bernard and Funnybones**. Through shared reading, discussion and a creative activity, children will build early comprehension, vocabulary and confidence in speaking and writing.



### Knowledge Explorers Weekly Themed Lessons


Help your child **explore** the world with exciting, hands-on learning! Each week we dive into a new topic—space, the ocean, weather, animals, history and more—through **stories, videos, discussion and simple activities**.



## KS2 Ages 7-11

### English Once - Morris Gleitzman

Explore this powerful and moving story set during World War II, following Felix's journey of courage and hope. Learners build **comprehension, inference and empathy**, developing strong discussion and writing skills while exploring character, theme and historical context.



### Art Rebel Art


Explore how artists use art to share powerful messages and stand up for what they believe in. Inspired by **Banksy and Keith Haring**, learners experiment with **symbols, slogans, stencils and bold colour**, creating their own message-based artwork while building confidence in visual communication and creative expression.



## UKS2/KS3 Ages 9-13

### Humanities The Inferno: A Journey, Not a Place

Explore Dante's world as a way to understand **medieval beliefs, morality and ideas about justice**. Through history, RE and ethics, learners examine how people in the past explained right and wrong, the role of guidance and consequence, and how values shape behaviour. Lessons use discussion, mapping, and reflection to connect historical thinking with modern life.



### Geography Development & Urbanisation

Explore how towns and cities grow and why development looks different around the world. Learners investigate **urbanisation, quality of life, population change and inequality**, using maps, case studies and discussion to understand how human choices shape places and communities.



## UKS2/KS3 Ages 9-13

### History The Tudors

Step into the dramatic world of the Tudors and explore **power, religion, daily life and royal drama**. Learners investigate key figures and events, building **historical enquiry, source analysis and chronological understanding** while discovering how Tudor decisions shaped England's future..



## KS3 Ages 11-14

### English The Book Thief Markus Zusak

**We Continue** our study of this powerful story set in Nazi Germany, exploring themes of **courage, loss and the power of words**. Learners develop **analysis, essay writing and critical reading skills** through close study of characters, narrative voice and historical context, bringing depth and confidence to their English work.



### Creative Writing

Unlock your imagination through weekly writing challenges that explore **character, setting, description and dialogue**. Learners **build confident writing voices, stronger vocabulary and storytelling skills** as they experiment with different genres—from suspense to fantasy to real-world drama. A supportive space to create, share ideas and develop crafty, compelling writing.



### Art Cultural Patterns

Explore pattern and design from around the world, inspired by **Islamic geometry, African textiles and Mehndi art**. Learners develop **drawing accuracy, repetition, symmetry and design skills** while researching cultural meaning and creating their own patterned tile or digital moodboard.




## KS4/GCSE Ages 14-16

### English

#### Pride and Prejudice: Jane Austen


We continue our dive into Austen's world of wit, romance and social expectation while building **confident analysis, essay writing and exam-ready reading skills**. Learners explore **themes, context, character development and Austen's sharp narrative voice**, developing strong critical responses and a clear understanding of this classic GCSE text.



### Art

#### Social Commentary

Explore how artists use images and words to communicate powerful messages about the world around us. Inspired by **Barbara Kruger and Banksy**, learners develop **conceptual thinking, symbolism and visual communication skills**, creating a bold poster-style artwork that responds to a social or cultural issue of their choice.



### Sociology

Explore big questions about **identity, power and inequality** while discovering why people behave the way they do. Learners investigate **rules, opportunity, crime, deviance and social research**, building confidence through real-life case studies and discussion. A perfect foundation for anyone considering **GCSE Sociology**, or who simply loves understanding how society works.



### Watercolour

#### Minibeasts and Bugs

Discover the tiny world of insects through watercolour as you paint **beetles, moths, ladybirds and dragonflies**. Learners build confidence with **fine detail, colour layering and brush control**, creating vibrant studies inspired by nature and close observation.



### Inspire

Explore bold colour, pattern and expressive style through the work of **Romero Britto, Laurel Burch, Henri Matisse, Olympia Zagnoli, Gustav Klimt and Maya Hayuk**. Each week, learners experiment with a new artist's approach, building **creative confidence, visual skills and personal style** through fun, hands-on projects.


